



CHAMP CAMP 2010 TOURNAMENT FORMAT

The 2010 Champ Camp Field consists of 70 teams.

If weather permits, teams will play one game on Thursday, three games on Friday, three games on Saturday and at least one game on Sunday. The two teams in the Championship Game will play one additional game.

Pool Play – Thursday & Friday

Teams are divided into 16 four-team or five-team divisions. Each team will play 4 games of pool play. Pool play will consist of 3 intra-divisional games and 1 inter-divisional game for the four-team divisions and 4 intra-divisional and/or inter-divisional games for the five team divisions.

All 4 games count equally toward playoff standings.

The winner and second place finisher in each division advances to the 32 team playoff format, which begins on Saturday morning. Division winners will be determined by:

1. Overall Record (in pool play - all 4 games)
2. Head to Head Competition
3. Record vs. Common Opponent(s)
4. Goal Differential
5. Tournament Selection Committee

Saturday - Sunday Morning

For the balance of the weekend, non-playoff teams will play inter-divisional games against teams they have not played. Teams losing in the playoffs will continue to play against teams they have not played.

Immediately after the Friday evening session, if not before, all coaches will be informed of what their "letter code" is for the balance of the schedule. For example, a team that finishes third in the A division would follow the schedule for "A3" for the remaining three rounds.

The Semi-Finals are scheduled for Saturday evening, but could be re-scheduled for Sunday morning. The Championship is Sunday at 11:30 AM. All teams will play one game on Sunday.

Game Format

Games must start on time. Wherever and whenever possible, a 5-8 minute warm-up period is provided. Teams are encouraged to stretch and begin warming up off to the side before they take the field.

Games are 25 minute (25:00) running halves with a five-minute (5:00) halftime. Teams are allowed one (1) one-minute (1:00) time out in the second half only. The game clock will stop on a team time out.

College rules apply. Teams play extra-man and man-down in penalty situations. Game officials will manage penalty time.

Tie games are decided by one continuous sudden death period. NO time outs are allowed in sudden death.

Game Officials

Certified high school and collegiate officials oversee every game. The games are governed by college rules and sportsmanlike conduct will be strictly enforced. Any repeated un-sportsmanlike conduct by a player or coach can be grounds for suspension or dismissal from the tournament.
